LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Courses-English Language Requirements

The teaching language in the Technical University of Crete is Greek. Erasmus students follow courses with the other international students where the instructor provides lectures/notes/bibliography in English Language. Erasmus students must be fluent in spoken and written English. If English is not their native language, students must show evidence of their fluency in English. For this, an **official proof of knowledge of the English language (a qualification of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – at a minimum level of B2 or equivalent)** is needed.

Dissertation/Research Projects

In case a student wants to do part of his/her dissertation or research work, he/she has to find a professor/advisor at the Receiving University (TUC) who will supervise his/her work and agree prior to starting the Erasmus period, on the working language. Apart of the Greek language, **English, French, German and Italian** are the foreign languages commonly used by members of the academic staff of TUC for research purposes.

If the proposed language of the work is not student's native language, an official **proof of knowledge of the respective language (a qualification of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – at a minimum level of B2)** is needed.
