Architect, DSA CRATerre - ensag

She is a graduate architect at the Escola Tècnica Superior d'Arquitectura de Barcelona. After taking part in the *amàco* pedagogical project from 2013 to 2018, she decided to deepen her research into the body (touch), and raw materials in architecture as a PhD student at Cresson laboratory. She is co-founder and co-director of the theater company Colectivo Terrón.

ASSOCIAZIONE LUCA NOLI

Created in December 2019, it is a non-profit organization, and its main objectives are to "encourage, disseminate and operate in the culture of architecture, landscape and urbanism; activate studies and researches on the architectural fields and related subjects".

ASSOCIAZIONE CITTÀ DELLA TERRA CRUDA

The Associazione Città della terra cruda was founded in 2001 as alliance between cities that recognize the value of earthen architecture and vernacular settlements as identitarian marks of the landscape of their territories, and as model for a sustainable development.

The association promotes the reuse of earth in the contemporary building supply chain, by encouraging the protection, recovery and reuse of traditional earth buildings and by promoting the use of natural construction materials for a sustainable living.

The association adheres to the international document "Inhabiting earth, for the right to build with earth", promoted in 2010 by CRATerre-ENSAG (France) and by numerous institutions who promote earthen architecture in the world.
